

Mr. Larry Lee Kimbrough

June 6, 1950 - May 2, 2022

Larry Lee Kimbrough of Dewy Rose, GA, aged 71, died Monday, May 2, 2022 at home, surrounded by his family. Born in Greensboro, GA on June 6, 1950, he was one of five children of the late James Rosser Kimbrough and Golden Faye Patterson Kimbrough. He graduated from Greensboro High School in 1968 and served his country in the United States Army. His life's work was spent in emergency medicine serving as a Registered Nurse and Paramedic in Clarke, Madison, Newton, and Jackson counties and emergency room nurse in Hall County, GA. Retiring to Linden, TN, he enjoyed hunting in the abundant hills and fishing on his beloved Tennessee River with his closest friends. In 2019, he and his wife purchased a second home in Dewy Rose, GA so they could be closer to their children and grandchildren. In addition to his parents, Mr. Kimbrough was preceded in death by his siblings, Robert "Bob" Kimbrough and Walter "Buddy" Kimbrough.

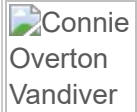
