

Mr. Willis Harvey Cook

December 17, 1944 - March 16, 2024

Willis Harvey Cook was born on Dec. 17, 1944 in New Orleans, Louisiana. His parents were Ervine Harvey Cook of Anguilla, MS and Noelie Ruth Laborde of Marksville, LA. After WWII they moved to Anguilla to farm the family's property there. In 1950 they moved to Jackson, MS where Willis attended middle and high school. He met his future wife, Carolyn Louise Addkison, at St. Joseph's High School there. They married in 1967 while Willis finished his Electrical Engineering degree at Mississippi State University.

After graduating Willis accepted a job with Georgia Power Company, moved the family to the Atlanta area and raised a family there. During this time he was at the forefront of the computer revolution. He wrote for and helped edit a magazine for Morrow Computer owners. Later he accepted a job with Patterson and Dewar Engineers, a consulting firm in Decatur and worked with electric coops across the South.

He retired on Dec. 31, 1999 at age 55. He and Carolyn then built their dream home together in Carnesville. Willis' hobbies were woodworking, writing and reading. He was a square dance caller after retirement and also wrote a monthly column for the Commerce News for several years.

In addition to his wife, Willis is survived by two sisters, Ditter Ingle of Rockport, TX, and Theresa Johnson of Laguna Niguel, CA and one brother, Mark Cook

of Florence, MS. He also leaves two sons, Stephen Cook of Stone Mountain, GA and David Cook (Jennifer) of Manitou Beach, MI, 3 grandchildren, Julia Dean of Glasgow, Scotland, Gage Dean of Rossvile, GA, Savannah Burkhart (Devin) of Ringgold, GA and one great granddaughter, Ava Jade Burkhart also of Ringgold.

A visitation will be held Saturday, March 23 at Little-Ward Funeral Home from 12 to 2 PM. Funeral Mass will be held at a later date at St. Catherine Laboure, Jefferson.

(Remember, I had been exposed to it - watching the SD tips - for nearly a year - and attempting to learn to Line Dance!) Well, I learned the SD moves quickly, with all those seasoned dancers, and then off we went to the GA State SD Convention (Macon) in September. And I danced my legs off in the MS and RD Halls and had a blast! I was then sold on Square Dancing!!

A HUGE thank you to Willis for doing that, and being patient with me, while I learned - as well as to everyone in the Square, and to Jim Roper for being my partner and for the use of his carport! I will never forget Willis' kindness and commitment.

And then there was all the engineering discussions we enjoyed during the breaks...

I really appreciated and enjoyed Willis - AND YOU, Carolyn!! I will never ever forget what Willis did for me in teaching me how to SD in Jim Ropers' carport those hot Sunday afternoons - at no charge to me!! How special that memory is to me. And I STILL love to SD!!

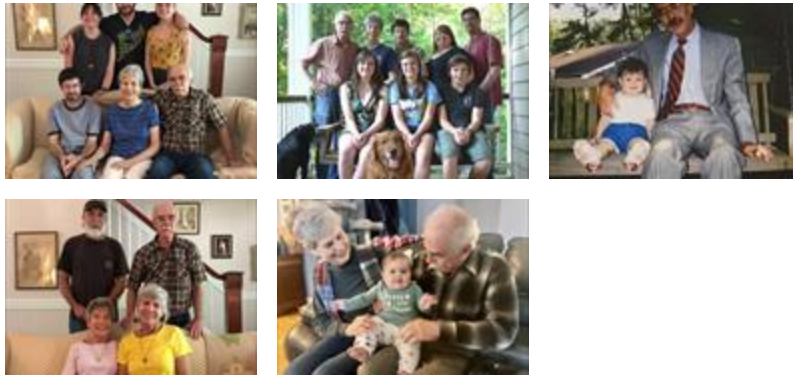
